- music and art
- technology and music
- music on radio, on television, on stage, and in academia

Abstracts on any topic of music will be considered. (Please note: specific SW/TX PCA/ACA areas exist for Grateful Dead and Rap/Hip-Hop scholarship. Proposals on these topics should be directed accordingly.)

Individual abstracts and complete panels of three and four will be welcomed.

**For individual submissions, please include name, affiliation, address, and email address along with the title of the paper, a 150-250 word abstract, and a brief bio.**

**For panel submissions, please include all the above along with a title of the panel and a 50 word summary of the panel's focus.**

**Scholars, teachers, professionals, and others interested in music-related topics** are encouraged to participate. **Graduate students are also particularly welcome** with award opportunities for best graduate papers.
